Market survey:

India is currently one of the most interesting growth markets worldwide. It has escaped the brunt of the global financial crisis basically because of cautious banking policies and only faced a slight slowdown..

India is predicted to become the fastest growing economy in the world by 2020 (ahead of China). In terms of purchasing-power it is already ranking on fifth worldwide.

Demographic trends, rising investment in education and infrastructure and an increasing integration into the global economy are having a particularly favourable effect on India's growth. The textile sector is making a special contribution to this development.

According to CITI- Confederation of Indian Textile Industry – significant extension of capacity is being undertaken not only by the large producers of textiles and clothing, but also by SMEs in the sector. Many of these companies also produce for the Indian market , which has enormous sales potential. For international manufacturers of textile machinery, this represents tremendous business opportunities.

The Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme (TUFS), which was launched in 1999 to provide various financial benefits to the industry, will expire in March 2012.
